

Excellence in Cardiovascular Sciences (EICS) Summer Research Program 2018

THE PROGRAM: Wake Forest University Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and Wake Forest School of Medicine in Winston-Salem, North Carolina will host a summer research program to increase diversity in health-related research. The program focuses on research training in the cardiovascular sciences with medical school faculty. The curriculum includes “hands-on” laboratory research, a lecture series that features presentations by faculty and guest speakers, and a research symposium at which the students present their research findings. Undergraduate students with an interest in a career in biomedical research are encouraged to apply.

ELIGIBILITY: Students applying to this program must be:

- ❖ Underrepresented minorities (i.e. African American, Alaskan Native, Asian-American, Native American, Pacific Islander or Hispanic), students with disabilities or from disadvantaged backgrounds (urban/ rural areas, first generation college student, etc.)
- ❖ U.S. Citizens or permanent residents of the U.S.
- ❖ Undergraduate students in good academic standing

PROGRAM DATES/INFORMATION:

The 2018 Excellence in Cardiovascular Science Summer Research Program session is May 30, 2018 thru July 27, 2018. Program participants receive a stipend of \$10/hour, housing in one of the WFU residence halls, and round-trip transportation expense. The fellowship program is sponsored by the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute.
