

Enhancing Undergraduate Education and Research in Aging to Eliminate Health Disparities (ENGAGED) Summer Research Program 2021

Wake Forest University and the School of Medicine, Wake Forest Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and Winston Salem State University in Winston-Salem, North Carolina will host a summer research program to increase diversity in aging-related research. The curriculum includes “hands-on” research, a lecture series that features presentations by faculty and guest speakers, and a research symposium at which the students present their research findings. Undergraduate students with an interest in a career in biomedical research are encouraged to apply.

PROGRAM DATES/INFORMATION:

The 2021 ENGAGED Summer Research Program session is from May 31, 2021 thru July 31, 2021. Program participants will receive a stipend of \$10/hour (40 hrs/week), housing in one of the WFU residence halls, and round-trip transportation expenses.

The ENGAGED program is sponsored by the National Institute on Aging, WFSM, WFU and WSSU.

ELIGIBILITY: Students applying to this program must be:

- ❖ Underrepresented minorities (i.e. African American, Alaskan Native, Native American, Asian-Pacific Islander or Hispanic), students with disabilities or from disadvantaged backgrounds (from urban/rural areas, first generation college student, etc.)
- ❖ U.S. Citizens or permanent residents of the U.S.
- ❖ In good academic standing
